
#### 80th BIRTHDAYS

Piacentini & Son's Longest Serving employee, Colin Resta (left) who celebrated his 80th Birthday on 17th May.



#### Panther Series II Low Loader

Piacentini & Son recently released the Panther Series II 360T Low Loader, designed, engineered and manufactured at the Picton workshop.

The innovative machine focuses on safety, ease of operation, reliability and serviceability.

It will improve safety on mine sites and has the potential to increase productivity and efficiencies which ensures the Australian industry is adapting and facing the challenges to meet needs in the current market.

The entire deck moves up and down by remote control to



allow mining equipment to be safely loaded and when lowering the deck, the rear wheels will lift entirely off the ground allowing for excellent stability during loading and unloading.

This loader is focused on safety by ensuring a smooth transition for the machinery from the ramp to platform which eliminates pivot points during loading and unloading.

The safety factor makes this machine unique, and in this industry, safety is of paramount Importance.

Panther II is already on its way overseas where it will work on an international mine site.

Congratulations on the excellent work done by all involved in the machine's design and construction.

#### PRICE REHABILITATION PROJECTS

Piacentini & Son have successfully completed the rehabilitation of 3 very large waste dumps at the Tom Price mine site.

Earthworks commenced on 20<sup>th</sup> June 2017 and were completed on 28th April 2018. During that time approximately 2 million cubic metres of material were shifted using dozers only.

Eight dozers were employed on the 3 waste dump Projects with a total of 11,500 dozer hours completed. Over 102 hectares of embankments were ripped and seeded consuming over 820 kgs of various seed varieties.

The MMW4 & Section 7 Waste dumps which were completed in early January already have very good coverage of vegetation on them.

#### **NEW PROJECTS**

#### Image Resources Boonanarring Gingin

Piacentini & Son have commenced Civil Works for the new Image Resources Mineral Sands mine at Boonanarring, 15 minutes north of Gingin.

The civil works involve construction of the Plant infrastructure pads, go-bay, roadworks and associated drainage facilities.

The onsite team has been under the leadership of Kevin Pears who has been joined by Paul Gregory, returning from his time in the Pilbara.

Stripping of the topsoil and overburden removal for the mining operation is scheduled to commence 15<sup>th</sup> May 2018 which will create challenges establishing a workforce from around Gingin and surrounds, as there will be no on-site accommodation.

#### Iluka Resources Cataby

Piacentini & Son have been awarded the Mining Contract for the new Iluka Resources mine at Cataby

This Project has been on the drawing board for a long time and it is great to see it finally come to fruition.

Mobilisation of the equipment, workshop and infrastructure is in full swing with topsoil stripping commencing on 9<sup>th</sup> May and overburden removal scheduled to commence before the end of May 2018.

In full swing the Project will employ a workforce of 130 and involve the movement of approximately 1.5 million cubic metres of material per month (Ore and Overbur-
