1000 DAYS INJURY FREE

In August 2017, the team at Kwinana attained the milestone of 1,000 days Injury Free.

The 24 hour a day, 7 day a week project includes unloading bauxite trains, and 980 Loader operation to maintain the bauxite feed to the Kwinana Refinery. In addition to this, Alcoa's light vehicle fleet are maintained onsite with support from the Myara Maintenance Workshop.

This is a milestone that we are all very proud of, and would like to congratulate all involved. The team has proven to be proactive in creating and ensuring a safe work environment and were awarded Piacentini backpacks in recognition.

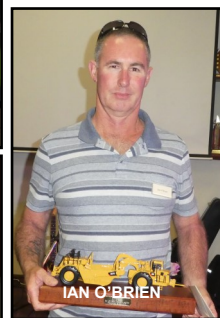

South Australia - Jacinth Ambrosia



Work at the Jacinth Ambrosia site has commenced, and the team are conducting the following works :

Wall raise on the 3A and 3B walls on the tails storage facility. Site are currently removing over burden and carting to TSF, setting up MUP pad for the MUP to be placed into position to commence mining on the 10th of December.

The team are relocating ore into the current ore block to be mined , but first they will need to set up haul roads, bunding and signage around site, buttressing of the 3A dam wall, dust suppression on site, and set up of go bays.

The setting up of the workshop and yard area is also in progress. There are currently 62 people, 30 various machines overall, supporting ancillary equipment, and LV's, onsite.

This is almost full capacity, which is expected in mid December, to meet the scheduled start up date.

Karara Export Terminal

On the 12th of September 2017, a significant shipping milestone of 40 million tonnes was reached with the sailing of the MV Nicole from the Karara Export Terminal.

Since 2013, Piacentini and Son have been operating out of the Mid-West Port Authority for Karara Mining Limited.

Although there have been numerous challenges and a number of Media news articles reporting Karara's possible financial difficulties the project is still steaming forward.

Karara are now planning to increase annual export tonnes which will bring benefit to the Mid-West for all of Karara major contractors and suppliers.
